Public Art Policy

Fairfax allows placement of art on or around public lands, so long as the display benefits the residents and merchants of Fairfax.

All displays must adhere to the following guidelines:

Works of art will include but not limited to:

- Painting
- Sculpture
- Crafts
- Textiles
- Mosaics
- Photography
- Stained glass
- Calligraphy
- Graphic arts
- Mixed media

Composition of art shall be of material durable against vandalism, theft, weather and require a low level of maintenance.

Public art display shall consider scale, material, form and content in relation to immediate and adjacent buildings and landscaping.

All costs of installation shall be borne by applicant unless other arrangements have been agreed to between the town and applicant.

Each applicant must fill out an application and receive approval from PARC. The Public Works Department, the Design Review Committee and the Town Manager have the discretion of taking the application to the Town Council for approval or denial.

Ongoing care and maintenance shall be identified as such, and burden of ongoing maintenance shall be taken into account in considering the application.
