

**A PROCLAMATION OF THE FAIRFAX PLANNING  
COMMISSION OF THE TOWN OF FAIRFAX  
COMMENDING PETER LACQUES FOR HIS SERVICE AND  
CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE TOWN OF FAIRFAX**

**WHEREAS**, Commissioner Peter Lacques has served the citizens of Fairfax as a member of the Fairfax Planning Commission from March 1, 2005 through February 4, 2009 when he was reappointed by the Council to serve a second term through February 28, 2013; and

**WHEREAS**, Peter Lacques worked tirelessly and in the best interest of the community and its residents as the chair of the Planning Commission in 2009; and

**WHEREAS**, Peter Lacques has reviewed and acted on planning issues that run the gamut from straight forward fence height variances and encroachment permits to matters with weighty social implications such as medicinal marijuana dispensaries; and

**WHEREAS**, Peter Lacques has worked on updating the Fairfax General Plan since 2005 and was a driving force in completing the draft in 2010; and

**WHEREAS**, Peter Lacques became one of the first Planning Commissioners to use his life experiences and all around good taste to act on design review applications when the duties of the Commission and the Design Review Board were combined in February of 2012; and

**WHEREAS**, Peter Lacques has stood unbendingly for the principles of good government, environmental protection and the preservation of Fairfax's small town character; and

**WHEREAS**, Peter Lacques has stepped down from his position as a Fairfax Planning Commissioner as of February 28, 2013 to focus on his legal practice and furthering his musical career; and

**WHEREAS**, Peter Lacques leaves his position as a Planning Commissioner with the heartfelt thanks of his fellow Commissioners and the citizens of Fairfax.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Town of Fairfax thanks Peter Lacques for his dedicated service to the Town and declares that the Town of Fairfax owes him a debt of gratitude because of the many years he gave freely of his time to make Fairfax a better place.
